



Addleshaw Goddard's newly constructed headquarters in Milton Gate, London were announced as the winner of the 'Workplace' category in the 2010 Lighting Design Awards. The project's M&E Consultant, Chapman Bathurst, entered the scheme in the awards for its innovative and distinctive lighting design.

Tryka LEDs were used within the corridor areas to illuminate a full height glass partitioning. This was done through the use of Tryka's Cool White Linear Strip Module System, with over 174m of the product supplied by Edward Ray Lighting.

The LEDs were designed to edge light the glass partition and therefore after many site tests it was decided that the best choice of optic had to be a narrow 6° beam with the LEDs positioned accurately to avoid dark spots towards the centre of the wall. To assist with the dispersion of light and to ensure an even coverage the design firm introduced a 6mm sheet of 'plexiglass' in-between the inner wall and the outer glass wall; with the LEDs mounted directly above and underneath, provided the throw of light required to achieve a run of light along the full length of the glass.

For this project Tryka also offered a custom build interior solution to assist with the cable run-off by introducing a rotatable, 90° cable gland rather than the standard IP68 cable gland.
